EQUALIZATION PENSION INCREASE COMING SOON – SOME WIDOWS AFFECTED

If you retired from the MPD before February 15, 1980, you are under the **Equalization** system. If you retired February 15, 1980 or after, you are under the **COLA** (Cost Of Living Adjustment) system.

Those under COLA, get increases each year, based on the cost of living. Those under Equalization get increases when the Active members of the Department do.

The following applies to AORP members under Equalization and recent widows of members under

Equalization.

For retired members in the rank of Sergeant and below, those increases are negotiated by the Union representing Sergeants, Officers and Detectives. For retirees in the rank of Lieutenant and above, they receive increases in pensions in the same percentages that the City awards to their active counterparts.

for sergeants and below in the MPD of 4% effective April 2, 2013. The award also put in place 3% increases effective on each of the first pay periods of October 2014, 2015 and 2016. The total increases are 4%(effective April 2013), 3%(effective October 2014), 3%(effective October 2015) and 3%(effective October 2016) equaling at total of 13% between April 2013 and October 2016.

The D.C. Retirement Board (DCRB) has recently received the necessary documentation and authorization to increase the pensions of AORP members who are under Equalization by 4% effective retroactively to April 2013. They are working now to make the necessary increases as quickly as possible. We will send out a blast email and post the actual date the pensions will be increased as soon as we know it.

Widows, of retirees who were under Equalization, may be entitled to some of the retroactive payment if their spouse was alive during any part of the period beginning April 2, 2013

We will send out a blast email as soon as we know when the increase will be in your annuity check.

CAN YOU HELP?

Sergeant Edward Talbert was a member of the MPD from 1967-1991. When he retired, he was a Patrol Sergeant in 2D. Ed died in 2007.

In January, the home of Ed's son, Chris, was burglarized. One of things stolen was a box containing Ed's memorabilia. A good friend of Chris', Officer Jessica Jensen of the Johnston Police Department in Iowa, has contacted me to request that I reach out to members who served with Ed to see if you might have "any photographs of Ed over the years and/or would be willing to write or tell her stories about your experiences with him."

We notified members of this request by email earlier this year and Officer Jensen appreciated your response.

(WEP or Windfall Elimination Provision is a federal law that reduces the Social Security retirement benefits that can be received by most retirees, who are eligible for them, in addition to pensions from jobs that were not covered by Social Security. If you were first eligible to retire in 1985 or earlier, whether you did or not, the WEP should not have been used to compute your Social Security benefits.)

In the March edition of the **ROLLCALL** newsletter, we published an article entitled, "Social Security Benefits". The information prompted several of our members to begin the process of determining their status with regard to the Windfall Elimination Provision of the Social Security Act.

We'd like to thank the Pension Officer in the Office of Pay & Retirement Services (OPRS), Ms. Jaininne Edwards, for contacting us to correct some information and update us on some other aspects of the application of the Windfall Elimination Provision on MPD and Federal law enforcement officers. First, the OPRS has moved. It is now located at: 441 4th Street, NW, Suite 410S, Washington, D.C. 20001.

Members of the AORP who retired from different law enforcement agencies need to contact different personnel authorities to secure assistance with the Windfall Elimination Provision. MPD personnel are to contact the D.C. Retirement Board at (202)343-3272 for assistance. Members of the Secret Service or the United States Park Police, who qualify for 20 year retirement, should contact the OPRS at (202)741-8660. Members of the U.S. Capitol Police should contact the Federal Office of Personnel Management. (Ms. Edwards has forwarded the letters received by the OPRS, in error, to the appropriate personnel authorities. Thanks to her for this courtesy.)

If you have any question about which is the proper authority for you to contact, please call the personnel office for the agency from which you retired. (PLEASE DO NOT CALL THE AORP.)

DCRB IMPROVEMENTS IN BENEFITS PROCESSING CONTINUES

The Benefits Department of the D.C. Retirement Board has been successful in recruiting and hiring all staff members for the Quality, Compliance, and Projects Unit. This new unit, a recommendation of the Benefits Process Review project, will be vital in contributing to continued benefit process improvements by reviewing cases for errors, performing quality reviews, and completing many special projects.

The Benefits Department is still continuing to get positive feedback from annuitants regarding the communications efforts we have implemented. New applicants are mailed an initial letter confirming receipt of their application within 10 business days. This letter provides a date for their first payment and any retroactive payment due. For the month of April, 99% of the retirement cases have been processed and put in payment status within 60 days of receipt of the completed retirement application.

The Benefits Department now has a Member Services staff person in the DCR B reception area to assist walk-in customers. Staff has been successful in answering most of the benefits questions and providing copies of documents requested by walk-in customers. This process improvement reduces the retirement services analysts’ involvement with walk-in customers and thereby allows them to focus on processing cases.

DD-214

IT'S OFFICIAL; DD-214S ARE NOW ONLINE.

The National Personnel Records Center (NPRC) has provided the following website for veterans to gain access to their DD-214s online:

<http://www.archives.gov/veterans/evetrecs/index.html>

This may be particularly helpful when a veteran needs a copy of his DD-214 for employment purposes. NPRC is working to make it easier for veterans with computers and Internet access to obtain copies of documents from their military files.

Military veterans and the next of kin of deceased former military members may now use a new online military personnel records system to request documents.

Other individuals with a need for documents must still complete the Standard Form 180, which can be downloaded from the online web site. Because the requester will be asked to supply all information essential for NPRC to process the request, delays that normally occur when NPRC has to ask veterans for additional information will be minimized. The new web-based application was designed to provide better service on these requests by eliminating the records centers mailroom and processing time.

Please pass this information on to former military personnel you may know and their dependents.

Most importantly, I want to urge you to hold onto any of your police memorabilia or artifacts that may have had a significant role in our cherished history and should be displayed in our new museum when it opens.

The projects are not for profit efforts to raise funds to (1), renovate the unsightly water fountain memorial built in 1942 and integrate it into a new memorial by (2), designing, building and maintaining a police memorial befitting to those who made the ultimate sacrifice and (3), reestablish, fund and operate a museum to educate the residents, the young and visitors to our Nation's Capital of our unique and rich history. These three projects will take place in front of, adjacent to, and inside 300 Indiana Avenue, NW, respectively.

BACKGROUND OF THE PROJECT:

Our Board of Directors are listed to the left. We are a 501(c)(3) organization, incorporated in DC. We have obtained donations from sister organizations for seed money which allowed us to develop our website found at www.depolicememorial.org. This is a place for everyone to follow our efforts and to learn more about the Memorials and Museum. You are invited to go to the site to sign up for news of our progress by e-mail. We will send e-mail updates when appropriate. Among other things, the website will list our fallen heroes and show significant historic events about our members and the department. We hope to have a unique page called the Officer's Registry, which will allow current, former or relatives of former members to tell their stories about serving on the

MPD. The city has agreed to provide land for the memorial on the plaza between the Henry J. Daly Building (Police Headquarters) and the H. Carl Moultrie Courthouse (Superior Court). You may see photographs of this prime real estate on our website. We are now in the process of competing a memorial design amongst three top notch architectural companies so we can ensure the best of the best memorial design. We will begin seeking donations when the design is completed. Chief Lanier has allocated space inside headquarters for the museum and we are confident that by privatizing this effort, the museum will at long last come to fruition.

I am excited to announce that the well-known iconic American film actor, Mr. Harrison Ford, has agreed to be our Honorary Chair. He is a true friend of the MPD, having befriended several members during his film making days in Washington, DC.



DOLLARD SUTER FAMILY FUND TAX DEDUCTIBLE STATUS RESTORED!

One June 5, 2014, the IRS retroactively restored the tax-deductibility of donations made to the Dollard-Suter Family Fund (DSFF). The IRS ruled that all past contributions made to the DSFF are deductible as charitable contributions. If you donated to the DSFF since May 15, 2011 when the suspension was imposed, your contributions are deductible because the DSFF is a 501(c) (3) fund under the IRS regulations.

Of course, all future donations are tax deductible as well.
