Catania Bill Stalled

I am happy to report that thanks to the combined efforts of our AORP members; the Fraternal Order of Police Labor Committee; Chief Lanier and the unions representing the other affected D.C. employees, it looks like we have stopped Mr. Catania's bill to cut pension COLA's in half for police, firefighters and teachers until they reach their maximum Social Security retirement age.

After speaking with members of the City Council, their staffs and other representatives of the Unions for the affected employees, I believe the Catania bill will never get out of the Committee on Government Operations. The first sign of success was the fact that his bill was not included in the annual Budget Support Act (BSA) which the City Council uses to make mid-year adjustments to the budget in light of developing financial conditions. This lack of support for his effort to have his bill put in the BSA was a strong indicator that there was not much support for the Catania bill.

Subsequent to the testimony given before the Committee on Government Operations in April of this year, the City Council is now concerned about the attrition rate of the MPD. History shows that the MPD was unable to stabilize its numbers until the Congress passed 20 year retirement for our members in 1969. It seems that the 25 year retirement systems passed by the City Council during the fiscal crisis of the 90's may be contributing to the outflow of sworn MPD members. It is good to see the focus returning to the positive for our side.

While we are in better circumstances today than we were a few months ago, we must continue to be vigilant and prepared to respond if anything changes.

EQUALIZATION

There have been some positive developments in the negotiations arena for our active brothers and sisters in the MPD too. The Public Employee Relations Board (PERB) is up and running again under the new Mayor. The PERB acts as an administrative court for labor disputes in the District Government. Mayor Fenty had effectively shut it down by failing to appoint new members to this board. Since it lacked a quorum, it could not act on the numerous labor complaints filed by the unions against him.

One of the Unfair Labor Practice (ULP) complaints which was stalled is one filed by the FOP when the Mayor put a collection of outrageous demands on the negotiating table that were designed to hobble the FOP and stop effective representation. The FOP was not the only union to face this union busting tactic and negotiations ground to a halt across the District government.

The FOP's ULP was set for a hearing during the week of June 19. It will take some time (up to six months) for the hearing to be concluded and the Board to act on the recommendation of the hearing examiner conducting the hearing. Then, the PERB's decision may be appealed to court if either side feels there are grounds. Appeals of the PERB's decision are not routine and the new Mayor is more reasonable than Fenty ever was.

It is much more likely that negotiations will resume in the months ahead and the lack of raises will be addressed. Whatever the final outcome, our AORP members under equalization will be awarded increases in the annuities reflective of the new contract, when it is approved. Next year may be the year when the negotiations are finally completed.

HOW CAN I GET AN ACCESS CODE FOR THE WEBSITE?

We have a website exclusively for our members. To be able to read and put postings on the Guestbook; pay dues/buy merchandise; read the minutes from the General Membership Meetings or the Memoriam pages; and, much more, you must first get an access code. To do this, please go to the website at www.aorp.org and click on “HELP” at the far right under the banner. Next, click on “AORP MEMBER WEB SITE ACCESS”. You will then click on the box that states you agree with our terms and conditions and then you will enter your email address twice. Then you click on “Submit”.

When you submit your information, the website automatically sends you a return e-mail and requests that you click on the long blue link that will take you back to the AORP website where you will confirm that your user name and password is correct. It is also verifying that you put in your correct e-mail address. Once the website knows you entered the information correctly the website manager is notified that a new person is requesting access. The website manager then verifies that information with the AORP membership database. If you are a paid member, the website manager will approve access and send you an e-mail advising you that you have access to the website and all its features. Please note that the website manager in an AORP member and does not sit at the computer 24/7 so the final authorization sometimes takes a day or so.

If you have never had an access code, you will receive a message asking for a suggested user name. Be sure and follow all instructions carefully. Once that is done, you will receive your access code by email. That email will contain one more instruction that must be followed in order for your access code to work. This procedure is for added security because only active AORP members have access.

If you have had an access code in the past; but just can't remember it, follow the above instructions going to “HELP”. In this case, you will click on “LOST PASSWORD?” and follow the instructions. Please read everything carefully and follow the directions.

DATA FORMS COMING

Watch for your data form which will be mailed out in July. Make necessary corrections (legibly) so your information will be correct in the AORP 2011 Membership Directory. If there are no changes and you want your information included, you will not have to return the form. If you do not wish to be included in the directory, you will need to return the form indicating same.

The Police & Firefighters Retirement & Relief Board was contacted and the necessary application forms were sent to Ruth immediately. Thanks to the Andrews' case which was won in the DC Court of Appeals by our great attorney, Robert Deso, there was no delay in Sue Ann's case being processed. She received all back monies due; is now receiving a monthly annuity; and, will be entitled to an orphan's annuity upon the death of her mother.

CLARRIFICATION ON 20 YEAR LONGEVITY

As was reported to the membership at the time it occurred, the DC City Council passed the 20 year longevity bill (which was the first step in getting longevity for those of us who retired with at least 20 years but less than 25 (including military time).

Even though we were not successful in getting the bill to Congress due to Eleanor Norton Holmes refusal to go forward with it since Mayor Fenty would not approve it - and Congress refusing to take it up without Mrs. Norton's support - the DC law went into effect for any retirement time that fell after June 30, 1997.

Since that time, the DCRB has been making the necessary calculations/changes to implement the law for those affected. Those affected recently received the money due them retroactively since the law passed; and, will see their increase in their monthly checks from now on.

This does not apply to those of us who retired prior to July 1, 1997.

DO YOU HAVE YOUR LICENSE?

Don't forget to obtain the necessary documents your spouse will need to file for her survivor's annuity upon your death. They include a certified copy of your marriage license; certified copy of death certificate or divorce decree from last previous marriage for both of you, if applicable; and, DD-214 if you were in the military. Below are some metropolitan area courthouse addresses for your convenience. If you are unable to determine how to get your documents, please contact Janet Hankins on 202-438-1494 for assistance.

Arlington County: You may obtain a certified copy of a marriage license from the Circuit Court Clerk's Office that issued the marriage license. You may make the request in person or by mail. Be certain to include the following when submitting a request to the Clerk's Office: full name of the groom, full name of the bride, date of the marriage, and place of marriage. Include fee of \$2.50 by cash, money order, certified check, or in-state personal check made payable to the "Clerk of the Circuit Court", or by credit card (MasterCard and Visa only; a service charge of four (4) percent of the amount paid will be collected on credit card payments). Also, include a self-addressed stamped envelope and mail to the Clerk of the Circuit Court, 1425 N. Courthouse Road, Suite 6700, Arlington, VA 22201, (703)228-4372 - Hours: 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

City of Alexandria: To receive a certified copy of a marriage license/divorce decree, contact the Clerk of the Court, 520 King Street, Room 307, Alexandria, VA, 22314. (703) 746-4044.

District of Columbia: To receive a certified copy of a marriage license, you must provide the full names of the bride and groom, the bride's maiden name, and the date of the marriage. You must pay \$10 by cash or money order. Make money orders payable to Clerk, D.C. Superior Court. You may either come to the Marriage Bureau Section in person to get a copy or request a copy by mail. Moultrie Courthouse, 500 Indiana Avenue, Room 4485, Washington, DC 20001 (202) 879-4840. For certified copy of divorce decree call (202) 879-1261 (press #4 and leave message).

Fairfax County: To receive a certified copy of a divorce decree (prior to 2004) by mail, provide the names of parties, case number (if no case number, provide approximate date of divorce) and a \$5 money order payable to the Clerk of the Court. Also, provide a telephone number where you can be reached in case the \$5 does not cover the cost which is 50 cents per page plus \$2 to certify. Mail to Circuit Court Records Center, 1 University Plaza, 4500 University Drive, Fairfax, VA 22030, (703)246-6656. It takes approximately five weeks to receive the document. To obtain in person, go to 4500 University Drive, which is across from the George Mason Field House. Bring cash.

To obtain a certified copy of a marriage license by mail, provide spouse's full name, bride's maiden name and date of marriage. Send in \$2.50 money order payable to the Clerk of the Court to Fairfax County Circuit Court. Attn: Marriage Licenses, 4110 Chain Bridge Road, Fairfax, VA 22030, (703)691-7320. To obtain in person, go to first floor of courthouse. Bring money order or cash.

Howard County, MD: Certified copies may be obtained from the Marriage License department located at the Thomas Dorsey Building, 9250 Bendix Road, Columbia, Maryland 21045. You may request a certified copy by mail. Please include in your request: names, date of marriage, self-addressed stamped envelope and check or money order for \$5 payable to the Clerk, Circuit Court for Howard County. (410-313-5850)

Montgomery County: To obtain a certified copy of a marriage license go to or write to the Judicial Center, 50 Maryland Avenue, Rockville, MD 20850, Room 111 (Lobby) (240) 777-9460. When you request in writing, include: Names of the parties; Marriage license number (if you have it); Date of the marriage; Self-addressed stamped envelope; and, Check or Money Order to cover the fee of \$5.50 for each copy.

Prince Georges County: To receive a certified copy of a marriage license, you must provide the full names of the bride and groom, the bride's maiden name, and the date of the marriage. You must pay \$5 by cash or money order payable to the Clerk of the Circuit Court. To request by mail: Clerk of the Circuit Court, Licensing Division, 14735 Main Street, Room #171M, Upper Marlboro, MD 20772. To request in person: 14741 Governor Oden Bowie Drive, Room L15, Upper Marlboro (301) 952-3288.

St Mary's County, MD: To obtain a certified copy of a marriage license, you can either send a written request to Courthouse, P.O. Box 676, Leonardtown, MD 20650. You need to provide them with your full name, you wife's full name at the time of the marriage and the date of the marriage. The license will cost you \$5. Also, include a stamped, self-addressed envelope and a telephone number where you can be reached. OR, go in person to 41605 Courthouse Drive, Leonardtown, Maryland 20650 (301)475-7844 – ext. 4563

QUESTIONS/ANSWERS REGARDING AORP WEBSITE

(EVERYTHING YOU WANTED TO KNOW)

Q. What is the AORP website?

A. The AORP website (www.aorp.org) is a secure, on-line area dedicated for the use of our members only.

Q. How can I use the website?

A. First you must obtain an "Access Code." This can be done by following the instructions on page 2 of this newsletter.

Q. My access code doesn't work. What went wrong?

A. You did not follow all the instructions. Once you apply for your access code, you will receive an email providing the code AND telling you to comply with one more instruction contained in the email. The purpose of this last instruction is for security of our website.

Q. After carefully reading and following the instructions, I still can't gain access, what now?

A. Call Bob Arscott on (301)855-8039 or email him at bobarscott@sgmnow.com . Be sure and put AORP website problem in the subject line of your email. DO NOT CALL/EMAIL JANET.

Q. I've lost my password or how do I change my email address for the website?

A. Go to "HELP" under the banner on the far right.

Q. What so great about having the website?

A. The website allows you to communicate with others through the use of a "Guestbook". Members post information/questions/war stories (some greatly exaggerated just like in roll call) for other members to read and comment on if they choose. In other areas on the site you can read stories of retirees and historical events involving the MPD that have been compiled from the archives of the Washington Post. You can, also, read the Minutes from General Membership Meetings and the newsletters. You can order merchandise; pay your dues; read the Memoriam pages; and, access other information as well.

Q. Why is some of the information on the website out of date?

A. Our member webmaster, Bob Arscott, volunteers his time and does a great job handling the website. He is responsible for the many improvements that have been made over the years. Currently, some changes need to be made that will require a professional webmaster so be patient as the website gets an overhaul this year.

Q. When I order some merchandise, it says one price; but when I go to checkout, it is a little higher.

A. When we increased our prices (which were necessary due to our cost increase); we could not update the main page. That will be corrected when the overhaul is done.


