MARCH COLA WILL BE 1.5%

The AORP has been advised that MPD retirees and all Survivors will receive the annual cost of living increase in their March annuity check that arrives April 1st. The increase will be 1.5 percent. If you feel this amount is too low, just remember, our AORP members who retired from federal agencies, are receiving nothing.

DISTRICT PASSES LEGISLATION TO REDUCE ITS SHARE OF HEALTH PREMIUMS

The Balanced Budget Support Act was introduced to the City Council at the request of Mayor Fenty on November 23, 2010. The Act contained a provision that reduces the District's contribution to employees and retirees health plan premiums from 75% to 72%. The affected employee or pensioner would see their share of the premium increased from 25% to 28%.

Given the timing of the introduction, the day after Thanksgiving, the City Council completed the legislative process in just 18 business days. The public hearing was held on the third business day after introduction. This is faster than most "emergency" legislation and came at a time when there was the least opportunity to take notice and respond.

The District is facing a budget shortfall for FY 2011 well over 100 million dollars, so it must act as quickly as possible to enact savings throughout the City's budget.

Upon reading the Act, which has been passed into law, it was unclear who would be affected by the reduction in the District's contribution to employees and pensioners health plan premiums. Gary Hankins contacted the City Council and the City's Chief Financial Officer's office to clarify this. It took some time for the responsible officials to review the law and provide him with the official position on this.

Ultimately, it was decided that the law affected only those District employees who were hired after September 30, 1987, due to previous legislation that protected employees and pensioners hired before October 1, 1987.

Police officers hired on or after October 1, 1987, are under a 25 year retirement plan so they will not become eligible for voluntary retirement until October 1, 2012.

In order to understand how this law will be applied we will use an illustration that assumes the average health plan has a monthly premium of \$750. Using this

HOW CAN I GET AN ACCESS CODE FOR THE WEBSITE?

We have a website exclusively for our members. To be able to read and put postings on the Guestbook; pay dues/buy merchandise; read the minutes from the General Membership Meetings or the Memoriam pages; and, much more, you must first get an access code. To do this, please go to the website at www.aorp.org and click on “HELP” at the far right under the banner. Next, click on “AORP MEMBER WEB SITE ACCESS”. You will then click on the box that states you agree with our terms and conditions and then you will enter your email address twice. Then you click on “Submit”.

When you submit your information, the website automatically sends you a return e-mail and requests that you click on the long blue link that will take you back to the AORP website where you will confirm that your user name and password is correct. It is also verifying that you put in your correct e-mail address. Once the website knows you entered the information correctly the website manager is notified that a new person is requesting access. The website manager then verifies that information with the AORP membership database. If you are a paid member, the website manager will approve access and send you an e-mail advising you that you have access to the website and all its features. Please note that the website manager is an AORP member and does not sit at the computer 24/7 so the final authorization sometimes takes a day or so.

If you have never had an access code, you will receive a message asking for a suggested user name. Be sure and follow all instructions carefully. Once that is done, you will receive your access code by email. That email will contain one more instruction that must be followed in order for your access code to work. This procedure is for added security because only active AORP members have access.

If you have had an access code in the past; but just can't remember it, follow the above instructions going to “HELP”. In this case, you will click on “LOST PASSWORD?” and follow the instructions. Please read everything carefully and follow the directions.

TRINKET PEDDLER RECOGNIZED

Whether you order AORP merchandise on-line or through the mail, it is all handled by our Merchandise Guru, George Day. George orders, stocks, packages and ships all the various items that the AORP offers (see page 10) from his home. He follows-up on any concerns/problems; and makes the customer happy. 2011 MEMBERSHIP DIRECTORY

This Directory provides the name, address, phone number, email address, and spouse's name of every "active" member at the time of its publication. To be an "active" member, you must be a Life Member, an Associate Member or a Regular Member whose dues are current. We will begin working on the Directory this summer. Each active member will receive a datum form indicating the information that we have on file. You will have the opportunity to correct the data if it is inaccurate. These forms will not go out until after the June newsletter. You will, also, have the opportunity to indicate on the form if you do not want your information published. The Directory goes to our members only.

ARE YOU GETTING YOUR BLAST EMAILS?

The AORP sends out "blast emails" to our members who have provided us with their email addresses. These blast emails notify members of deaths, provide the Minutes of our monthly General Membership Meetings, the quarterly newsletter (ROLLCALL), important announcements, etc. If you are not getting these blast emails and would like to, please email your name and email address to Gary Hankins at gghankins@laborcops.com (do not send them to Janet). Please understand that when you receive an email from AORPHOTSHEET@laborcops.com reminding you that membership dues are due, we are not saying YOU didn't pay your dues. It is a general announcement to all the membership.

TIPS FOR RENEWING YOUR DUES

When renewing your dues, it is not necessary to send in a renewal form unless you have had a change in your address, phone number, email address or marital situation. When sending a check, please indicate your membership number in the memo section. You can find your number on your address label of your newsletter

If you paid your dues twice (as many of you did), your expiration date has been extended for an additional year. When possible, on-line dues payments are preferred over check payments as they cut down the amount of work on this end.

WHY DOESN'T ANYONE ANSWER THE AORP TELEPHONE?

When you call the AORP line (877-283-1065), you will be asked to leave a message. That message is then transmitted to my computer. I am able to hear you; and, when you speak clearly and in a loud enough voice, I can understand what you are saying. This allows me to listen to the messages and return calls, if necessary, at times that fit into my work schedule. Always, leave your name and the number you wish to be contacted on in case I cannot understand your request/comment. I respond to the messages as soon as I am able. This allows me to do my work in a more efficient manner. Leaving a message three times does not get you a quicker response. You will normally hear back from me the day of your call or the next. If it is an urgent matter, please contact me on my cell phone 202-438-1494. PENSION PROTECTION AND SUSTAINABILITY ACT OF 2011

On February 1, 2011, D.C. City Councilman David Catania introduced the Pension Protection and Sustainability Amendment Act of 2011. If passed, the bill would reduce the COLAs for the payments of benefits accrued by members of the Metropolitan Police Department, the Fire Department and Teachers after June 30, 2012. **It would not affect any current retirees nor would it affect members who retire before June 3, 2012.**

The bill provides that for those affected future retirees' COLAs would be reduced by 50% when they reach the official full retirement age established by the Social Security Administration. Under the current Social Security law, a person's full retirement age is determined by their date of birth. Depending on one's date of birth, the full retirement age may be as old as 67. Affected future retirees would continue to get their full COLAs until they reached the Social Security full retirement age.

This bill must go through the City Council's legislative process and be passed by a majority vote of its members before going to the Mayor for signature. That is not a certainty, but this bill is reflective of the City's continuing effort to find savings anywhere. **IF PASSED, THIS BILL WILL NOT AFFECT YOU!**

example, the District would currently pay 75% of that or \$563. The balance of \$187 would be paid by the employee or annuitant. Changing the formula to 72% and 28% for this example would decrease the District's contribution by \$23 per month to \$540 and increase the annuitant's from \$187 to \$210. The annual saving to the District would be \$23 x 12 months or \$276.

Current AORP members will not be affected by this change, but future retirees joining our ranks will be. While this may not affect you, it does represent the first example of the District changing the retirement benefits. The AORP will continue to monitor legislation to be prepared to react to future actions that might harm its members.

It is clear that our country, states and local governments

are all struggling under very difficult financial circumstances. It will probably continue to be so for years to come, given the staggering debt the government at every level has amassed. They will struggle to avoid bankruptcy and collapse year after year.

Some state and municipal retirement plans have already declared bankruptcy. Fortunately, the Congress is 100% responsible for the pensions of everyone who retired before July 1, 1997. The D.C. Retirement Board (DCRB) has wisely invested the funds it manages to finance the pensions for all those under its purview. George Suter, our elected representative to the DCRB reported at the February 2011 general membership meeting that they are 100% funded for future obligations.
