BOARD WILL RECOMMEND DUES INCREASE

On June 25th, the AORP Board of Directors met to discuss the financial condition of the AORP. All members were in attendance with the exception of Trustee Charlie Haines, who was excused.

As Treasurer, I have been concerned about the reduction of our reserve funds. Over the last three years, I have had to transfer over \$37,500 from reserves to our operating account to pay our bills. This has been necessary due to the low interest rates and higher expenses. In past years, we could supplement our income with the interest made on our investments.

After thoroughly reviewing all our expected expenses and ways to cut cost, the Board will propose a dues increase of \$10 to be voted on at the general membership meeting on Wednesday, September 5th, beginning at 7:00 p.m. This will bring our annual dues to \$35, and will be the first increase since 2004.

In an effort to cut expenses, the following changes will take place:

If that was not enough, Larry was notified that he no longer had Federal Health Insurance, effective December 2011, due to a change in DC Law.)

Since my last article in March, Larry has had several stays in hospitals due to high fevers caused by infection. (The infections have come from pieces of a surgical sponge that was left in Larry from one of his early surgeries. Hopefully, all the pieces will surface, be removed and his infections will stop.)

HOW CAN I GET AN ACCESS CODE FOR THE WEBSITE?

We have a website exclusively for our members. To be able to read and put postings on the Guestbook; pay dues/buy merchandise; read the minutes from the General Membership Meetings or the Memoriam pages; and, much more, you must first get an access code. To do this, please go to the website at www.aorp.org and click on “HELP” at the far right under the banner. Next, click on “AORP MEMBER WEB SITE ACCESS”. You will then click on the box that states you agree with our terms and conditions and then you will enter your email address twice. Then you click on “Submit”.

When you submit your information, the website automatically sends you a return e-mail and requests that you click on the long blue link that will take you back to the AORP website where you will confirm that your user name and password is correct. It is also verifying that you put in your correct e-mail address. Once the website knows you entered the information correctly the website manager is notified that a new person is requesting access. The website manager then verifies that information with the AORP membership database. If you are a paid member, the website manager will approve access and send you an e-mail advising you that you have access to the website and all its features. Please note that the website manager is an AORP member and does not sit at the computer 24/7 so the final authorization sometimes takes a day or so.

If you have never had an access code, you will receive a message asking for a suggested user name. Be sure and follow all instructions carefully. Once that is done, you will receive your access code by email. That email will contain one more instruction that must be followed in order for your access code to work. This procedure is for added security because only active AORP members have access.

If you have had an access code in the past; but just can't remember it, follow the above instructions going to “HELP”. In this case, you will click on “LOST PASSWORD?” and follow the instructions. Please read everything carefully and follow the directions.

TIPS FOR RENEWING DUES

When renewing your dues, it is not necessary to send in a renewal form unless you have had a change in your address, phone number, email address or marital situation. When sending a check, please indicate your membership number in the memo section. You can find your number on your address label of your newsletter

If you paid your dues twice (as many of you did), your expiration date has been extended for an additional year. When possible, on-line dues payments are preferred over check payments as they cut down the amount of work on this end.

I had posted a request on the AORP website for prayers that a physical therapist could be found that would provide the therapy at a low cost or free. God heard the prayers and the very next day I received a call from Peggy, wife of one of our members, Bill Mack. Bill had read my posting while he was out of town. He called his wife and asked her to contact her sister who accredited physical therapist in Maryland as well as other states. Through his sister-in-law, I received a list of MD therapist and decided I would start at the beginning and call each one until I got the right answer.

I said a prayer and decided to skip the first one and go to the second one on the list. After explaining Larry's situation and lack of insurance, I told the doctor it would be great if he would do it for free. He said, "Okay." Needless to say, I wanted to do the happy dance on my dining room table! Thank you, Doctor Everett Scott.

Prior to this, the wound doctor who was treating Larry said he needed access to a shower, as soon as possible, in order to be able to cleanse his wound in a specific manner. He had an accessible shower; but it was on the third level of his home. (One of our original goals was to have a stair lift installed that would allow Larry access to that floor.) Upon hearing of this need, we told Larry to contact the company that installed his other chair lift. This was around Easter and the salesman indicated it might take ten days or more.

When arranging for payment with the salesman, I told him how important it was to get this done as soon as possible. He said, "Don't worry, my wife used to be a 911 dispatcher." It was installed the next day!

Once Larry had access to his third floor, he needed another wheelchair. AORP Brother Charles R. Hall, Exalted Ruler, Prince George's County Lodge No. 1778 of the Benevolent and Protective Order of the Elks, was contacted. Unable to provide a used wheelchair, he donated a brand new one!

Since March, your generous donations to the Dollard-Suter Family Fund for Larry's benefit has allowed for the continued payment of his mortgage and other bills. With the installation of his chair lift and the donation of the extra wheelchair, everything has been done to allow him full access to his home.

It continues to be a wondrous joy to see God's hand in every step. Please keep Larry and his mother, Sharon, in your prayers. Pray that his wound will be healed, that he will regain his strength, and that he will be able to return to work. I look forward to writing that article!

RETROACTIVE PATROL SERVICE PAY FOR SOME RETIREES

The FOP Labor Committee and the City finalized arrangements for patrol officers and sergeants who answered calls for service, or supervised those who did, to receive an annual Specialty Pay of \$1,000. In order to qualify, the officer or sergeant must have spent no more than 45 days away from their patrol assignments in the calendar year for which they were receiving the pay. That includes details, vacations and sick leave. The Patrol Service Area (PSA) Pay is retroactive to October 1, 2006. Anyone who retired after October 1, 2006 and believes they qualified for the PSA Pay should contact Gary Hankins at ghankins@laborcops.com or on 202-438-1492.

HEALTH BEAT

(Disclaimer: This article is written for informational purposes only. It is not intended as a replacement for sound medical advice from a physician. Application of the information described herein is undertaken at the individual's own risk.)

If you only do one thing for your health, the healthiest thing anyone can do is to drink pure water. The earth is 70% water and so are our bodies. In nature, water is evaporated into clouds and then rain falls from the sky, basically distilling the water. Rain water is what we should drink, except we have polluted our air so badly, it pollutes the water. Further, numerous chemicals leach into our water. Some chemicals are even sanctioned by our government, such as chlorine and fluoride, both of which can cause cancer. Distilled water is the best; a close second is reverse osmosis filter systems. Water pitcher filters, bottled water and tap water offer little to no protection against aluminum, arsenic, bacteria, benzene, bromide, cadmium, calcium, cryptosporidium, fluorides, lead, magnesium, mercury, nitrates, phosphates, radon, sodium, total dissolved solids (TDS), total trihalomethanes (TTHM) and viruses. Our navy uses distilled water.

Source and suggested reading: "Water, the shocking truth," by Paul C. Bragg and Patricia Bragg. The Braggs are health crusaders, best known for Braggs Apple Cider Vinegar.

According to Dr. Batmanghelidj in his book, "Your Body's Many Cries for Water," chronic dehydration can contribute to many physical diseases, including addiction, allergies, Alzheimer's disease, angina, arthritis, asthma, attention deficit disorder, autoimmune diseases, back pain, cancer, chronic fatigue syndrome, colitis, constipation, diabetes, depression, fibromyalgia, gout, high cholesterol, heartburn, heart disease, high blood pressure or hypertension, hot flushes, infection, lack of energy, leukemia and lymphoma, migraines, osteoporosis, sleep disorders, obesity, kidney stones pain, skin conditions, stroke, etc.

He recommends that for every two pounds of weight, we drink one ounce of water. Someone weighing 200 pounds should drink 100 ounces of water a day. Today, we drink coffee, tea and sodas that may contain caffeine which dehydrates the body. Alcoholic drinks dehydrate us as well. If these drinks are consumed, it should be in addition to the proper amount of water, not in place of water. As we grow older, it becomes more difficult to distinguish between thirst and hunger. Be sure to satisfy your thirst first, instead of overeating. Note: Consuming a large amount of water at one time can be toxic. Drink the recommended amount throughout the day including upon awaking, 1/2 hour before meals, two hours after meal and before bedtime.

Water is a diuretic as well and in order to retain water, we need a sufficient amount of salt, 1/8 teaspoon for every 16 ounces of water. Sea salt is recommended because it is a natural salt. Check to make sure that it contains 60+ trace minerals as well.

A few examples of how water can help are: Pain - during exercise our muscles produce lactic acid. When there is not enough water to dilute and remove the acid, we experience pain. Asthma - breathing (the rushing of air in and out of our lungs) causes us to use and lose a lot of water. To conserve water the brain creates histamine. This restricts the lungs in order to conserve water. Sufficient water removes this condition and salt is an antihistamine. Alzheimer's disease - our brains are 85% water. It is constantly working and producing acid. When salt enters the cells, it flushes the acid out and then water dilutes it and carries it away. If the acid is not removed it destroys the cells. High Blood Pressure - Our cells contain water and there is water outside the cells as well. Pressure allows the water to enter and exit our cells. When we are dehydrated, the body raises our blood pressure to force water into our cells. Due to space restriction only a few examples are provided here. To better comprehend the various ways water can help refer to Dr. Batmanghelidj's book.

SUNSCREENS - are promoted as a way to prevent cancer. However, there are ingredients in sunscreens that can cause cancer. The best protection is to wear clothes to cover yourself. Avoid the following ingredients in sunscreens:

Oxybenzone - A hormone-disrupting chemical linked with endocrine disruption and cell damage (and low birth weight when used by pregnant women). Oxybenzone can penetrate the skin and enter your bloodstream and is an ingredient in about half of sunscreens.

Retinyl palmitate - A vitamin A compound associated with the accelerated growth of skin lesions and tumors. Manufacturers put vitamin A derivatives in sunscreens because they are popular antioxidants that slow signs of aging, such as wrinkles and rough skin. But FDA data suggest that vitamin A has photo-carcinogenic properties, which means that when exposed to the sun, it may speed up cancer formation. The Environmental Working Group (EWG) found retinyl palmitate in 41% of sunscreens.

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HEALTH BEAT

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Titanium Dioxide - has only been the subject of three human studies as to carcinogenic effect. But it's been established as a cancer-causing agent in several animal studies, leading the ACS to peg it as "a possible carcinogen in humans."

Accidental Inhalation - Sunscreens are meant for external use only, but when you use them in the increasingly popular spray or powder forms, you are in danger of inhaling them. While inhaled particles of any size can pose a health risk, tiny nanoparticles -- ultra-tiny particles used in many of these formulations -- can more easily penetrate linings and tissues in your body and cause inflammation.


