## HOW CAN I GET AN ACCESS CODE FOR THE WEBSITE?

We have a website exclusively for our members. To be able to read and put postings on the Guestbook; pay dues/buy merchandise; read the minutes from the General Membership Meetings or the Memoriam pages; and, much more, you must first get an access code. To do this, please go to the website at [www.aorp.org](http://www.aorp.org) and click on “HELP” at the far right under the banner. Next, click on “AORP MEMBER WEB SITE ACCESS”. You will then click on the box that states you agree with our terms and conditions and then you will enter your email address twice. Then you click on “Submit”.

When you submit your information, the website automatically sends you a return e-mail and requests that you click on the long blue link that will take you back to the AORP website where you will confirm that your user name and password is correct. It is also verifying that you put in your correct e-mail address. Once the website knows you entered the information correctly the website manager is notified that a new person is requesting access. The website manager then verifies that information with the AORP membership database. If you are a paid member, the website manager will approve access and send you an e-mail advising you that you have access to the website and all its features. Please note that the website manager in an AORP member and does not sit at the computer 24/7 so the final authorization sometimes takes a day or so.

If you have never had an access code, you will receive a message asking for a suggested user name. Be sure and follow all instructions carefully. Once that is done, you will receive your access code by email. That email will contain one more instruction that must be followed in order for your access code to work. This procedure is for added security because only active AORP members have access.

If you have had an access code in the past; but just can't remember it, follow the above instructions going to “HELP”. In this case, you will click on “LOST PASSWORD?” and follow the instructions. Please read everything carefully and follow the directions.

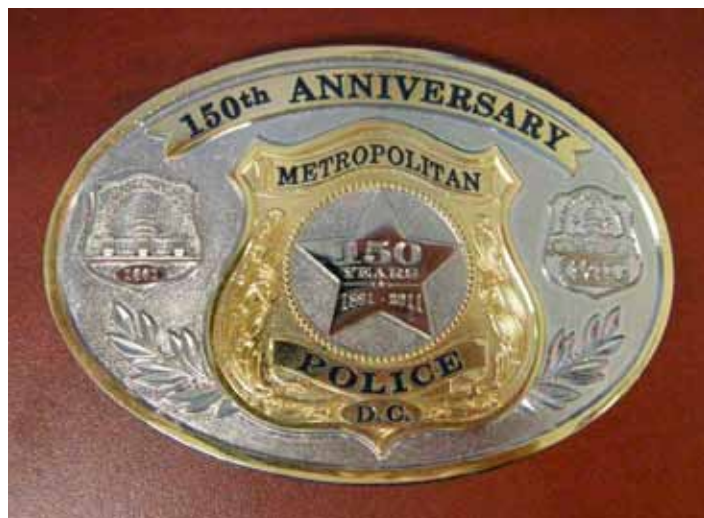
## COLLECTOR BADGE SETS NOW AVAILABLE

## AORP ATTORNEY STOPS IRS ATTACK ON MEMBER

After more than 30 years of disability retirement, one of our Brothers suddenly starting receiving “**Notices of Levy and Liens**” from three different IRS offices. He contacted the AORP and got “the package” of documents which he sent to IRS on his own. Instead of a reply, he got more notices from IRS.

IRS levied his Social Security payments and put a lien on his bank account and house. The member was immediately referred to our attorney, Robert Deso who sent a notice of appeal and request for a hearing to three different IRS offices.

After about a week, Mr. Deso received a call from a nice lady in the IRS office in Kansas City. All of his correspondence had been forwarded to her. Based on that correspondence; she contacted the bank and Social Security and released all the liens and levies.

“I don’t know why this problem comes up sporadically with your members,” Bob said. “It seems like it should come up often, or not at all.” IRS sent a formal notification to our member that his account has been zeroed out. They also sent an IRS form for him to file for a refund of any bank charges he incurred as a result of the IRS levy actions. Another job well done by Robert E. Deso, Esquire.

# HOT OR MILD?

If you wanted to find a crowd of police, federal agents, and firefighters on any given Monday through Friday, you need only go to 1317 Pennsylvania Avenues, SE. There, at Mangialardo's (which translates "to eat lard"...and we all know that things cooked with lard taste the best), you will find a G-Man of another stripe; but definitely Italian.

Back in 1953, Antonio and Anna Mangialardo opened an Italian grocery in an old Safeway on 12th Street, SE. A short time later, they moved to Pennsylvania Avenue and added a deli. As the older Italians died off, take-out quickly became the main business. When the riots hit DC in 1968, they began selling more and more subs to the police.

After Antonio died in 1977, his sons, Alex and Joe, took over the business adding pizza and breakfast to the menu. Anna ran the cash register before passing on in 1984. Joe's wife and today's matriarch, Lucille, would come in to help with the "sub rush" after getting her two sons, Tony and Alex, off to school.

One day, an FBI agent asked Joe to make him a special sub and told him what to put on it. The next day, two more agents came in asking for the "G-Man" ... and a legend was born.

After Alex left the business in 1997, Joe and Lucille continued on. Their sons had been helping out on Saturdays and during summers since they were 10; and when they finished school, Tony and Alex came aboard full time. When Joe died in 2005, Tony and Alex took over the business; but in 2006, Alex and his family moved to South Carolina to pursue other opportunities.

Today, 7:30 to 3:00, Tony continues this long tradition of providing great subs, whether an order of one or one hundred. His kids, the fourth generation, can be found behind the counter when they are not attending college. And, Mom Lucille? She still comes in a couple times a month to visit her "fans"; but they might have to issue a "look out" if they want her too often... she is busy enjoying retirement.

## QUESTIONS/ANSWERS ON DUES & MEMBERSHIP TYPE

### **Q. When do my dues expire?**

A. Check the address label on this newsletter.

### **Q. When are my dues due?**

A. The first of January after the year they expire. (See previous question)

### **Q. Why does it take so long for my dues check to clear?**

A. We receive your dues check when the postal system decides to deliver it! During the peak season, we receive thousands of pieces of mail (some that have been in the postal system for 3 weeks) that have to be opened, checks must be entered in your data file and then prepared for deposit.

### **Q. What type of Membership do I have?**

A. See page 2 of this newsletter.

### **Q. I am an Associate Member. Do I pay dues?**

A. No, you are not required to pay dues. If you do, your dues payment will be donated to the Dollard-Suter Family Fund.

### **Q. I retired 40 years ago, why am I not a Life Member?**

A. Many AORP members retired more than 30 years ago, but did not join the AORP right away. Quite a few members belonged to the Police Association which was a totally separate organization from the AORP. The Police Association went defunct in the late 80's. Quite a few of those members joined in 1994.

### **Q. How will I know when I am a Life Member?**

A. Each year the data base is reviewed and all new Life Members receive a letter and a Life Membership card.

### **Q. Why don't you send out dues renewal notices?**

A. Sending out individual notices is very expensive. We do send out the blast emails, post it on the AORP website and put it in the newsletter. Dues of \$25 only go so far.

## MPD'S ONLY CONGRESSIONAL MEDAL OF HONOR HERO

Historical records reveal that one of MPD's finest was first decorated with the ultimate military award, the Congressional Medal of Honor (MOH).

You probably haven't heard of the Battle of Powder River that was fought on March 17, 1876 in the Montana Territory. It was the first of three disappointing campaigns for the U.S. Cavalry; the third one being Custer's last stand.

The weather conditions could not have been worse; the commander was court-martialed for dereliction of duty, and by all accounts the Major General failed to inform the commander that he was camped 10 miles away from the designated location.

While there were "only" four deaths and six casualties for the Cavalry, there was still the opportunity for a great act of heroism performed by Private Jeremiah J. Murphy. His citation follows: *"The President of the United States of America, in the name of Congress, takes pleasure in presenting the Medal of Honor to Private Jeremiah J. Murphy, United States Army, for extraordinary heroism on 17 March 1876, while serving with Company M, 3d U.S. Cavalry, in action at Powder River, Montana. Being the only member of his picket not disabled, Private Murphy attempted to save a wounded comrade."*

Private Murphy was 17 years old when he joined the Army in 1875. He was 19 when he received the MOH and 24 when he was discharged. The following year he was appointed to the Metropolitan Police Department and served as a mounted officer in the 6th Precinct. Nineteen years later he was promoted and transferred to the 10th Precinct where he served as a mounted sergeant. Promoted to lieutenant after 12 more years, he served in the 2nd Precinct until his retirement in 1918. (Records suggest that Lt. Murphy worked as a guard at the Library of Congress for 15 years after his retirement.)

While one Washington Post article dated December 27, 1903 does not provide his initials, Jeremiah has to be the subject of "SERGT. (sic) MURPHY'S RIDE". At the end of the article, the reporter wrote the following verse, *"I was well acquainted with Sergt. Murphy, And can therefore certify, That he was a man who feared no setter, And could shoot one if necessary on the fly. He knew a mad dog when he seen it, And, right off, with his little gun, He'd chase that mad dog over a dozen counties, And get him at the end of the run. There's a lot of heroes and public benefactors, Gathered on the evergreen shore, But Sergt. (sic) Murphy don't take a back seat for none of 'em, And on that I'll rest my gore."*

Jeremiah Murphy died at his daughter's home in Detroit in 1932. He is buried at Mount Olivet Cemetery in Washington. In 1976, the Veterans Administration designed a tombstone to be placed at the graves of all Medal of Honor recipients. Due to Mount Olivet's regulations, none was placed at Jeremiah's.
